Intended Recipient & Location: Borough of Sea Bright

Project Name: Sea Bright Emergency Facilities Complex

Project Purpose: This project will improve and renovate the Municipal Emergency Facilities in order to house all emergency services. There is an eleven member police department and an all- volunteer Fire and First Aid Department which serves not only the 1800+ Borough residents but the Gateway National Park at Sandy Hook as well. These professionals and volunteers have ensured the safety of residents as well as visitors to Sea Bright and Gateway National Park from fire, flood, panic and other natural and man-made disasters, specifically including the protection of life and property.

Project Name: Emergency Operations Center

Project Purpose: The Township is seeking funding to outfit a new Emergency Operations Center that will allow Cherry Hill to strengthen its coordination and subsequent response in both routine events and emergencies that may arise. The funding would provide for technology investments and upgrades that would make it easier for local first-responders to coordinate with county officials, School District and municipal staff that respond in such emergencies. The proposed EOC project provides a dedicated emergency-management center with six breakout rooms to support operations, planning, governmental policy and public information spaces.

Project Name: Emergency Management Communications System

Project Purpose: The City of Orange wishes to convert the Office of Emergency Management and Fire Department communications technology and equipment to a narrowband radio

frequency. The funding will be used to purchase equipment that will ensure the ability of the city's Emergency preparedness organization to continue to function under National Incident Management System (NIMS) guidelines in the command, control and coordination of emergency response personnel apparatus and equipment.

Project Name: Office of Emergency Management Expansion

Project Purpose: Funding will be used for the construction, mitigation and renovations of the existing 9-1-1 and emergency management operations facility in Cumberland County. This project will provide a secure location for the public safety answering point (9-1-1) in Cumberland County. Cumberland County provides dispatching services for fire, emergency medical services and other support agencies. This project will also allow for the future expansion of the 9-1-1 facility to provide law enforcement dispatch.

Project Name: Emergency Management Operations Center

Project Purpose: The County is seeking funding to renovate and equip Hudson County's new OEM facility with state-of-the art information technology and communications equipment. Given Hudson County's high-risk status as a target for man-made and/or natural disasters, this project will significantly increase the county's preparedness and ability to deal with a disaster, create hundreds of construction jobs and sustain a number of law enforcement positions in the county. This project also has national significance since the County also plays an important role in providing ancillary support to New York City in case of any emergency.

Project Name: Union Mill and Hartford Flood Mitigation Plan

Project Purpose: The flood mitigation plan will allow the Township to solve the roadway flooding on both Union Mill and Hartford Roads. This flood mitigation project will have regional transportation benefits to Mount Laurel Township, the County of Burlington and the State Department of Transportation. It will also enhance public safety by ensuring that future anticipated increased traffic demands from local economic development can be met and that these roadways will remain passable as primary roads and emergency evacuation routes.

Project Name: Back-up Emergency Communications Center-Radio Paging

Project Purpose: The Township is seeking funding to purchase and install a new radio/paging system for the Township of Livingston's Joint Emergency Operations and Dispatch Backup Center. This project will increase the safety of emergency personnel operating in the field by allowing the dispatcher to track the calls on a computer screen. The dispatcher will have the ability to dispatch emergency calls without going through a multi-step process to page out emergency services. This will improve the dispatch center's ability to handle the high volume of calls during an emergency.
